Q : Can I order my medication over the phone from the surgery

A : No, because we can't legally take a prescription order over the phone. However, Medicines Orderline can take your request because they have the contract to do so locally. Call : 0115 8550 260 8am – 4pm Monday to Friday

Q: If I find I have run out of medication, or I only have one left can I call the surgery to get an emergency prescription issued.

A : No, NHS111 have now been commissioned to provide patients locally with repeat medication at short notice.

Please ensure that you contact the surgery if you cannot attend an appointment. Currently, we are seeing an increase in the number of patients who are not attending which means that other patients can't have these appointments. Please be considerate to fellow patients who would be grateful for an appointment at short notice.

Why can't the GP just refer me to the hospital for my joint or muscular issue?

The GP will refer you to our First Contact Physiotherapist, Anas. If you need further treatment, he will then refer you via MSK (musculoskeletal) Clinical Assessment and treatment service (CATS) in Derby City.

Cavendish Health Provider Ltd was established in 2010 by Lister House Surgery and Village Street Surgery in Derby, to enable the provision of enhanced services to patients in a primary care setting.

This service will:

- Assesses your condition
- Start your treatment
- Provides seamless transfer for further treatment by referring you on. This can only be provided by MSK CAT service and is not directly available for your family GP to do.
